LILLY ENDOWMENT COMMUNITY SCHOLARSHIP

The Clinton County Community Foundation is pleased to honor the recipient of the 2014 Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship. Due to the generosity of Lilly Endowment, one Clinton County student will receive a full-tuition scholarship, required fees and a special allocation of up to \$900 per year for required books and equipment for four years of undergraduate study at any Indiana public or private college or university. This year's recipient is **Dalton Bush**, son of Tamara Bishop and the late David Bush.

Dalton, a Frankfort High School graduate, was a member of Key Club and the National Honor Society. He participated on the varsity tennis and baseball teams, and bowling league. Other activities included the Bowling Club, DECA, high school band and TKO bowling league.

Dalton's awards and honors are Tennis and Baseball Academic All Conference, Scholastic Award Tennis, Four-Letter Varsity Award, Most Valuable and Most Win's Record for baseball, Bowling High Average/ Series and Tennis Best Record.

He plans to attend Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology to study software engineering.

This is the seventeenth year that the Endowment has funded the Lilly Endowment Community Scholars program for outstanding students in Indiana. The Community Foundation defined the criteria based on the Endowment's stated goal to "raise the level of educational attainment in Indiana." The criteria identified by the Foundation and used in the selection process were: scholastic achievements; school, community, and work activities; essay; financial need; and an interview.

There were 25 qualified and eligible Clinton County students who applied for the scholarship. A committee of volunteers evaluated the applications and selected five finalists who were interviewed by the Clinton County Community Foundation Board and Scholarship Committee.

The Clinton County Community Foundation has awarded 71 scholarships and renewals from 19 funds for 2014. The total value of the scholarships awarded is approximately \$373,700, including the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship.

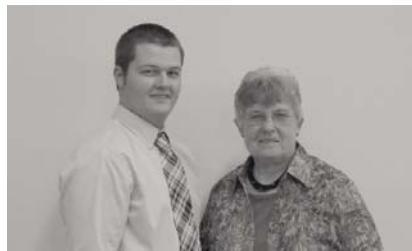
