Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship

The Clinton County Community Foundation is pleased to honor the recipient of the 2015 Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship. Due to the generosity of Lilly Endowment, one Clinton County student will receive a full-tuition scholarship, required fees and a special allocation of up to \$900 per year for required books and equipment for four years of undergraduate study at any Indiana public or private nonprofit college or university. This year's recipient is **Kristyn Webb**, daughter of Dan and Barbara Webb.

Kristyn, a Frankfort High School graduate, was president of the National Honor Society, hours chair of the Zonta Club and captain of the varsity girls' soccer team. She also was on the varsity softball team and a member of the Modern Music Masters, Key Club and Tri-M. Kristyn volunteers for the Humane Society.

She was selected as the Distinguished Young Woman of Clinton County. Other awards and honors include Psi Iota Xi Top Junior Girl, Sportsmanship Award for softball and soccer, State Solo and Ensemble gold and silver medals, and a Scholastic Award.

Kristyn plans to attend Purdue University to study environmental engineering.

For 18 years Lilly Endowment has funded the Community Scholars program for outstanding students in Indiana. The Community Foundation defined the criteria based on the Endowment's stated goal to "raise the level of educational attainment in Indiana." The criteria identified by the Foundation and used in the selection process were: scholastic achievements; school, community, and work activities; essay; financial need; potential for success; and an interview.

There were 22 qualified and eligible Clinton County students who applied for the scholarship. A committee of volunteers evaluated the applications and selected four finalists who were interviewed by the Clinton County Community Foundation Board and Scholarship Committee.

The Clinton County Community Foundation has awarded 74 scholarships and renewals from 19 funds for the 2015-16 school year. The total value of the scholarships awarded is approximately \$250,430, including the Lilly Endowment Community Scholarship.
